US 41 Project lane closures for July 29 – August 2

Traffic restrictions in Brown and Winnebago counties

(Green Bay) The Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) Northeast Region office in Green Bay is announcing US 41 Project lane restrictions for July 29 – August 2 in Brown and Winnebago counties. Drivers should be aware of 11-foot wide lanes and reduced speed limits in both counties and remember to use caution while traveling through any work zone. Details of all closures are included below.

Winnebago County

US 41

Drivers will encounter various lane closures on northbound and southbound US 41 between WIS 21 and US 45 on Monday, July 29 from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m.

Brown County

US 41

Drivers should anticipate various overnight single lane closures on southbound and northbound US 41 along the entire Brown County corridor from south of Scheuring Road to Lineville Road. Lane closures can vary along the corridor, so drivers are urged to pay attention to road signs, slow down and use caution when entering any work zone. The US 41 Project plans to have at least one lane of traffic open at all times on both northbound and southbound US 41 during construction. This does not include shutdowns by local authorities for accidents or unusual incidents (such as weather).

WIS 29

Drivers can expect various overnight single lane closures on eastbound and westbound WIS 29 from County J to Taylor Street throughout the week. On Wednesday, July 31, the southbound on and off-ramps will be closed overnight from 9 p.m. to 6 a.m. In addition, the northbound US 41 off-ramp to WIS 29 will be closed overnight on Wednesday, July 31 and Friday, August 2 from 9 p.m. to 6 a.m. The following detour in place:

- **Northbound US 41** traffic wanting to exit WIS 29 will be detoured to exit at Mason Street
- **Eastbound WIS 29** traffic will take Mason Street east to Military Avenue and follow Military Avenue north to eastbound WIS 29
- **Westbound WIS 29** traffic will take Mason Street west to Packerland Drive and follow Packerland Drive north to westbound WIS 29

Lineville Road

Drives can anticipate a full overnight closure of northbound and southbound US 41 at Lineville Road on Tuesday, July 30 from 9 p.m. to 5 a.m. US 41 traffic will be detoured at the off-ramps to Lineville Road, continue across Lineville Road and re-enter US 41 via the on-ramps. The

southbound US 41 off-ramp to Lineville Road will also be closed overnight on Wednesday, July 31 and Thursday, August 1 from 9 p.m. to 5 a.m.

Mason Street

Closure of the southbound US 41 off-ramp to Mason Street will begin Wednesday, July 31 and last until September 2013. Southbound US 41 traffic will have access to the Mason Street exit by using the Shawano Avenue southbound off-ramp, crossing WIS 29 and accessing Mason Street from the southbound US 41 on-ramp from WIS 29. Expect significant traffic delays on eastbound and westbound WIS 29.

WIS 29 Tub girders

Over the next few weeks, steel tub girders will be lifted and set to construct the WIS 29/US 41 interchange flyover ramps. Drivers can expect various full overnight closures of US 41, WIS 29 and/or nearby ramps during these lifts. WisDOT will send a road closure alert and suggested detour to media, www.US41Wisconsin.gov, and social media a day prior to the expected girder lift. Tub girder lifts are very weather dependent and subject to change.
