



Frequently Asked Questions

What hours will the trail be open? – The trail is open 24 hours a day, every day.

Is there a trail fee to use the crossing? – There is no fee to use any part of the trail.

Will the trail be plowed in the winter? – No.

Are dogs allowed on the trail? – Yes, on an 8-foot leash.

Are horses allowed on the trail? – No, horses are only allowed on designated sections of the Wiouwash Trail at specific times of the year.

Are motorized vehicles allowed on the trail? – No, with the exception of those used for ADA accessibility. The trail will not be groomed and open for snowmobiles or ATV's and violators will be issued a citation by the Winnebago County Sherriff's Department.

Will there be bathrooms and refuse containers along the trail? – There may be a porta potty seasonally located at one end of the crossing. All trails are "carry in - carry out" so no refuse containers will be positioned along the crossing.

Where can I park? – You can legally park at the Westwind Trail Head parking lot, or along Marine Drive on the north end of the crossing, or along Rath Lane and Butte des Morts Drive on the south end of the crossing.

What are all the designs and kiosks for? Who created them? – The Lake Butte des Morts Causeway features design characteristics dedicated to Wisconsin's Native American tribes. Kiosks display information about each tribe, and a Native American architect designed aesthetic features for sections of the causeway that are inspired by the natural elements earth, fire and water. At the north end of the causeway, a kiosk will provide information about the history of Lake Butte des Morts.
